Criteria For Call To Orders - Final: Negative Characteristics To Be Avoided In A Candidate For The Permanent **Diaconate:** Humanly, a person who lacks maturity, tends to be imprudent, and is controlled by a poor self-concept and a rigidity that prevents growth would not be a suitable candidate for the office of the Permanent Diaconate. It will be inappropriate to ordain as an official minister of the Church a person who tends to abuse Church authority, misrepresents the Church, and approaches clericalism as a status symbol. Finally, a person who lacks a commitment to genuine spirituality and is insensitive to the real needs of others would not be a likely candidate to be a living sign of Christ the servant.





We find ourselves in the Second Week of Lent with no commitment to better prayer lives, doing good deeds, or practicing acts of self-denial. But it is never too late. Catholic Relief Services offers a great resource to parishes and families for praying, fasting and charitable giving—all in one simple project.
